#### Concept Note:

Sanskrit Studies have taken a sharp turn during the last few decades, embracing some of the newly emerged issues such as gender studies, human rights, computational Linguistics etc alongside conventional / traditional subjects such as Vedic studies, Smrtis, Schools of Indian atheist and non-atheist philosophies etc. that have in no way lost an iota of their significance. But the change in outlook of the scholarship of present age has given birth to a number of novel research areas that the scholars were hardly concerned with in the early years of the last century.

Consequently, Sanskritic research has turned out to be all the more intra-disciplinary and inter-disciplinary, opening up whole new vistas for the modern scholars of Sanskrit. Even when the study involves an age old theme of heritage, it does entail at any rate some of the points of utility in modern society.

Hence, the combinations of ancient knowledge and modern approach coupled with newly constructed theories have led Sanskritic research to a greater height showing a higher trajectory in the graph of research development. Modern scholars are now in a position to explain as far as practicable a few complexities of ancient culture not only in the light of ancient knowledge alone but also in the light of modern perspectives, and also significantly, some intriguing features of modern society in the light of ancient wisdom.


